General Information

The Colloquium will be held on the Edgbaston Campus of the University of Birmingham. Most sessions will take place in the European Research Institute Building (Pritchatts Road). Final details will be sent by email to registered participants in the week before the Colloquium.

Several options have been reserved for accommodation. The availability of each venue is limited, and rooms will be allocated in order of receipt of bookings. All accommodation is ensuite and includes breakfast. **Lucas House** is 5 minutes' walk from the Colloquium venue: double rooms (for single occupancy) and twin rooms are available (please arrange room sharing in advance). **Woodbrooke** is two miles from the venue (10 minutes by taxi, 40 minutes on foot).

Participants are asked to specify a first and second choice on the booking form, and will be informed by email as soon as their accommodation has been confirmed. A sheet with further suggestions in the city centre and elsewhere is available for those who wish to make their own accommodation arrangements.

A post-conference excursion to visit the Birmingham Museums Collection Depot is being planned for the Wednesday afternoon. This will be a guided tour behind the scenes where artefacts from the archaeology collection, natural sciences and sculpture are stored.
